

Used Motor Vehicle and Parts Commission Report By ADR Staff

Chairman John Longacre convened the December 12, 2017, session of the Used Motor Vehicle and Parts Commission (UMV&PC). Following roll call and approval of the November 2017 meeting minutes, Longacre called on Commission Director John Maile for his report.

Director Maile informed the Commissioners that staff continued to process license renewals. To date, there are about 540 non-renewals, versus just 125 two years ago. Maile said there were still a large number of incomplete applications that staff is working through. The criteria for getting a license out by the January 10 date is conditional upon the Commission receiving the completed application by November 1. Maile noted that they are way past that and are into December for issuing renewals.

Legislative liaison, Curt Roggow, reported that a request had been made for a bill letting the license tag stay with the owner. Senate staff has contacted Roggow requesting the bill language. January 18 is the deadline for bill filing. The 2018 legislative session starts February 5, 2018. Roggow noted that the legislators are looking for revenue.

Chief Investigator John Lancaster informed the Commissioners that staff had completed 24 inspections and had handled 30 complaints.

A total of 24 dealers attended the on-site education program. Applicants for a new license and dealers involved in significant rule violations are required to attend the Commission's education program as a part of acquiring or maintaining a state license. The education sessions are held in the first floor conference room at 421 NW 13th, Oklahoma City. Classes are held on Monday prior to the Commission meeting on the second Tuesday of each month. The sessions run from 9 a.m. to about noon or 1 p.m. Attendees are asked to make reservations so staff can be prepared to accommodate everyone.
