

Used Motor Vehicle and Parts Commission Report **By ADR Staff**

Chairman John Longacre convened the January 8, 2018, session of the Used Motor Vehicle and Parts Commission (UMV&PC). Following roll call and approval of the December 2017 meeting minutes, Longacre called on Commission Director John Maile for his report.

Director Maile informed the Commissioners that, as of January 5, there were 272 non-renewals for used motor vehicle licenses. Revenue was down in December by \$44,000 because of the number of non-renewals. By comparison, two years ago there were only 150 non-renewals.

Director Maile told the Commissioners that they were required to put the legislative liaison contract out for bids. The application process involved a 21-page requisition. Curt Roggow as the only person to apply.

Chief Investigator John Lancaster informed the Commissioners that staff had completed 26 inspections and had handled 12 complaints.

A total of 22 dealers attended the on-site education program. Applicants for a new license and dealers involved in significant rule violations are required to attend the Commission's education program as a part of acquiring or maintaining a state license. The education sessions are held in the first floor conference room at 421 NW 13th, Oklahoma City. Classes are held on Monday prior to the Commission meeting on the second Tuesday of each month. The sessions run from 9 a.m. to about noon or 1 p.m. Attendees are asked to make reservations so staff can be prepared to accommodate everyone.
