

## **Used Motor Vehicle and Parts Commission Report By ADR Staff**

Chairman John Longacre convened the February 13, 2018, session of the Used Motor Vehicle and Parts Commission (UMV&PC). Following roll call and approval of the January 2018 meeting minutes, Longacre called on Commission Director John Maile for his report.

Director Maile called on Curt Roggow for the legislative report. Roggow reported the following:

- Representative Mike Osburn introduced House Bill 2776. The bill would consolidate the Oklahoma Used Motor Vehicle and Parts Commission with the Oklahoma Motor Vehicle Commission.
- Senate Bill 1339 by Senator Kim David provides that the owners of a vehicle retain the license plate registered to them at the time they sell the vehicle. The license plate may be affixed to the next vehicle the owner purchases after they have registered the vehicle and paid the excise and sales tax due.

Director Maile reported that Senate Bill 1174 by Senator Kim David limits the authority of a political subdivision of the state to create new occupational fees or licensing requirements or to continue to regulate certain professions; requires a waiver of occupational fees and fees from licensing requirements for certain low-income individuals, military families and young workers.

Chief Investigator John Lancaster reported that investigators are calling previously licensed dealers who have not submitted their renewal application.

Lancaster informed the Commissioners that staff had completed 19 inspections and had handled 26 complaints. Staff also conducted one informal hearing.

A total of 27 dealers attended the on-site education program. Applicants for a new license and dealers involved in significant rule violations are required to attend the Commission's education program as a part of acquiring or maintaining a state license. The education sessions are held in the first floor conference room at 421 NW 13th, Oklahoma City. Classes are held on Monday prior to the Commission meeting on the second Tuesday of each month. The sessions run from 9 a.m. to about noon or 1 p.m. Attendees are asked to make reservations so staff can be prepared to accommodate everyone.
