

## Using 30 Day Temp Tags

### *Purpose:*

- The 30 Day Temp Tags are legal for use only on vehicles that have been sold by a dealer to a customer.
- The 30 Day Temp Tags are not to be installed on vehicles being demonstrated, transported, or used in any other normal business of a dealer.
- If a customer reports a tag lost or destroyed, a dealer may issue a replacement tag filled out with the same information. The date entered on the replacement tag shall be the original date of the sale, not the date of reissue. Note the reissued number on the Bill of Sale and record the reissue on the sequential log sheet.
- The 30 Day Temp Tags are valid for 30 days following the date of sale.

### *Completion of 30 Day Temp Tags:*

- Using a 1/4"-tip black permanent marker, enter the date of sale (mm/dd/yy) in the green blocks.
- Enter the vehicle year, make, and model in the space provided.
- Enter the name of the purchaser in the space provided. If the customer prefers, the term "Bill of Sale" may be entered. If that term is used, then the purchaser will be required to keep the Bill of Sale in the vehicle at all times until the vehicle has been registered in the purchaser's name.
- Record the unique serial number of the temp tag on the associated Bill of Sale.
- Record the transaction on a sequential log sheet.

### *Installation of 30 Day Temp Tags*

- Remove any out-of-state tag. Leave any Oklahoma permanent license plate in place.
- Mount the temp tag in the location of the permanent license plate on the rear of the vehicle. (If necessary, mount the temp tag over the permanent Oklahoma plate.)
- Do not place the temp tag in a sleeve or plastic cover.
- Securely mount the temp tag using all four screw holes. If a tag cannot be fastened in the two bottom holes, use double-sided tape to secure the lower corners.
